City Council Meeting
Monday, October 24, 2022

The meeting of the City of Belleville Council was held on Monday, October 24th, 2022 at 7:00 p.m. at the Belleville City Council room.

CALL TO ORDER:

Mayor Adam Robertson, called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Pastor Rick Snodgrass offered the opening prayer and comments. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

ATTENDENCE:

Council members present: Pam McGregor, Mike Nondorf, Doane Sells, James Doyle, Mike Palmquist and Nick Cox.

City Staff present: City Manager Adam Anderson, City Treasurer April Ludacka and City Attorney Aaron Westbrook.

Others present: Fred Arnold, Waylon Sheetz, Rick Snodgrass, Dawn Surber, Arlene Clayton Andy Clark and Harley Ludacka.

APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES AND DISBURSEMENTS:

Mike Palmquist made a motion to approve the minutes from the October 10, 2022 regular Council Meeting. James Doyle seconded the motion, which carried unanimously on a voice vote.

James Doyle made a motion to approve the appropriations and disbursements. Mike Nondorf seconded the motion, which carried unanimously on a voice vote.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Arlene Clayton commented on fentanyl.

OLD BUSINESS:

Andrew Clark, with A.C Customs, addressed the Council regarding the EV charging station downtown. He has recently got internet set up with Cunningham Cable to accept payments and fixed the electrical box to make it safer. He is hoping to have a second charger in the next couple weeks. He will also be applying for grant funds to install a fast charger, but will not know if he has qualified until next year. The City will continue to monitor the progress of the EV station.

Doane Sells made a motion to approve Resolution No. 2022-033, setting the City Manager's annual salary at Seventy-Five Thousand Seven Hundred Forty-Eight Dollars and Twenty-Six

cents (\$75,748.26). Mike Palmquist seconded the motion which carried unanimously on a voice vote.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mike Palmquist made a motion to approve Resolution No. 2022-034, abating a junked vehicle at 1810 O Street. James Doyle seconded the motion, which carried unanimously on a voice vote.

James Doyle made a motion to approve a Parade permit for the Veterans Day Parade, on November 11th, 2022, for around the downtown square. Mike Nondorf seconded the motion, which carried unanimously on a voice vote.

Costs for repairs of a private sewer line were submitted to the City. The sewer line at Stephen's Collision, 1513 15th Street appeared to be damaged when the City had the water mains replaced a number of years ago. Costs to fix the line were \$1,058.86. Mike Palmquist made a motion to pay the cost of the repairs. James Doyle seconded the motion, which carried unanimously on a voice vote.

The Council discussed the upcoming time change when Council meetings would begin at 6:30 p.m. starting on November 14th. The consensus was to continue with meetings at 7:00 p.m. Mike Palmquist made am motion to approve Resolution No. 2022-035, setting the time of regular Council meetings to 7:00p.m., year-round. Mike Nondorf seconded the motion, which carried unanimously on a voice vote.

CITY ATTORNEY'S REPORT

There will be no court in November.

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT:

City Manager Anderson stated that North Central Regional Planning will have its 50th Anniversary banquet on November 10 for those who would like to attend.

Council pictures will be taken at the November 28th meeting.

COUNCIL MEMBER/MAYOR COMMENTS:

James Doyle commented on how nice Rocky Pond looks.

Mike Nondorf mentioned the rest rooms at Rocky Pond are looking good.

Mike Palmquist also commented on Rocky Pond and thanks to all employees.

Pam McGregor stated how she appreciates the sidewalk program and the improved sidewalks in town.

Nick Cox thanked the City staff for their work.

Mayor Robertson also mentioned how nice Rocky Pond looks and asked about a City Christmas/Awards Banquet this year. Work is being done with Economic Development and looking at different land options.

ADJOURNMENT:

James Doyle made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Mike Palmquist seconded the motion, which carried unanimously on a voice vote. The meeting adjourned at 7:37 p.m.
